# Counsellor's Corner



Tanisi Families!

In February, we participated in Pink Shirt Day which is a day to learn about and bring awareness to anti-bullying. The word bullying gets a lot of attention and for good reason. It is serious and we need to protect victims. Did you know there is a difference between bullying, conflict and mean moments?

Students need to know how to get along with others. We are always working with students to enhance their social skills here at school and we know you do at home as well. Kids are going to make mistakes, just like adults. We all have mean moment where we may say something without thinking or get caught up in the moment with big feelings. We also all have conflict at some point or another where we disagree with someone. These interactions are not bullying.

Bullying, on the other hand, is a repeated behavior that's intended to hurt, harm, or intimidate someone. It can take many forms, such as physical violence, verbal abuse, social exclusion, or cyberbullying. Bullying involves a power imbalance, where the person who is bullying has more power or influence than the person being bullied. Unlike conflict, or a mean moment, bullying is not a normal part of life and can have serious consequences for the person being bullied, including physical and emotional harm.

It's important for parents, teachers, and other adults to be able to recognize the difference between mean moments, conflict and bullying so they can respond appropriately. If your child is experiencing conflict or a mean moment, it's important to help them learn how to manage their feelings and communicate effectively with others.

Of course, if your child is experiencing bullying it is important that you talk to their teacher, counsellors, or administration to address the issue collaboratively. We want all of our students to feel safe in their learning environment!






















### Regular Attendance is Important
