You have probably already seen the **field trip permission forms** coming home. Parents are joining many of these field trips and other activities in the school and we are so happy to have you! Our grade 1, 2 and 3 will be attending **Camp Maskepetoon** on June 10, 11 and 12. We will have cultural teachings, crafts, games, food, and lots of fun! Elders will be sharing their knowledge and skills.

2024-25 EES SCHOOLWIDE GOALS



As a Leader In Me school, we understand the importance of setting goals. At the beginning of the school year, we created two measurable and achievable goals in areas of importance to our school. We created these goals with the knowledge that every student and staff member can contribute to and work towards goal achievement. These are the two goals we worked towards this year and some of the strategies we used to achieve them.

BY THE END OF JUNE 2025, OUR SCHOOL WILL IMPROVE OUR OVERALL AVERAGE ATTENDANCE BY 5%.

Regular school attendance is an area of significant importance to our school and to the success of our students. Although we only improved our overall attendance by 2% from last year, we still feel that we have achieved success for this goal. Here are some of the strategies and incentives we used as a school.

- students log their daily attendance in their Leadership Binders, instilling responsibility
- after each monthly assembly, perfect attenders are recognized and get to choose a treat from the Perfect Attendance Cart
- classrooms with the highest attendance receive the attendance trophy which they can display in their classroom for the month!
- students with over 97% attendance over the year receive recognition and a special incentive at the end
 of the year

BY THE END OF JUNE 2025, EACH CLASS WILL INCORPORATE A MINIMUM OF 20 CREE WORDS ONTO THEIR WORD WALL.

At our school, we recognize and value the Nehiyawewin language. In addition to daily Cree classes and Nehiyawatisowin once a week, we felt it was important to create a goal in our classrooms that our teachers and students could work towards achieving. We feel successful in this goal because of high teacher participation applying the following strategies

- teachers and students agreed on which new words to add to their Cree Word Wall.
- we made the Cree Word Wall an expectation for every teacher during Classroom Walkthrough Checklists



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


Wow! We have made it to the final month of school! With the warm weather, we will be outdoors for some of our final PE classes.
